

WILSON COURT DOCKET CROWDED WITH CASES

Wilson, Sept. 9.—The abrupt termination of the September term of Wilson Superior court, occasioned by the sudden death of Judge W. R. Allen and the attendance at the funeral of his brother, Judge Oliver H. Allen, who was holding court here, leaves the criminal docket of Wilson county in a bad way.

When court convened Monday there were on the docket 533 cases, half of which were not disposed of. The fall term will be called at an early day. The next regular term will not convene until late in December.

The only important case tried was that of Ben. Reid, colored, for killing his wife in this city several months ago. Through his counsel he submitted to murder in the second degree and was sentenced to serve a term of seven years in the penitentiary.

VIRGINIA PEANUT CROP AFFECTED BY DROUGHT

Petersburg, Va., Sept. 9.—Virginia's peanut crop this year will be less than 50 per cent of normal and in some sections will be a total loss, according to reports made here today at the meeting of the Virginia Peanut Growers' Association. It was declared that the decrease in the yield is due to the long drought which came during the growing season. About fifty representative planters were in attendance at today's meeting.

Elmira, N. Y., Sept. 9.—The Willlys-Morrow Company, in this city, which manufactures parts for the Willlys-Overland automobiles, today issued a call for two thousand former employees to return to work. The plant has been closed for several weeks.

Mrs. Strickland was the widow of Dr. Strickland, who died a few weeks ago in a Charlotte hospital. She was stricken sometime ago with paralysis, from which she never recovered. The deceased was a native of Franklin county and was a most excellent lady.
