

51ST ARTILLERY REACHES IREDELL

Advance Convoy of Troops Repairing Bridges For Moving The Heavy Guns

Statesville, Sept. 23.—The advance convoy of the 51st artillery which is moving from Camp Jackson, S. C., to Camp Smith, Va., is camping for a few days on the farm of W. N. White, east of town. The convoy consists of 165 men, of which number 40 are engineers and the rest coast artillerymen. Lieut. Richard Lee, engineer officer, is a descendant of Gen. Robert E. Lee; Capt. Chas. H. Stuart, in command of the train of trucks, is a son and nephew of General J. E. B. Stuart.

The advance convoy is repairing all bridges and marking the route for the movement of the heavy guns and tractors which will follow in about ten days. The heaviest guns of the convoy are eight 155 G. P. F. of sixteen tons each, and eight ten-ton six inch howitzers. All guns are pulled by ten-ton caterpillar tractors. The convoy has about 40 trucks, and a number of motorcycles, supply trucks and touring cars.

Wilson, Sept. 23. The official tobacco sales on the Wilson market for the week ending September 22 as reported by H. B.
