New Enterprises

A charter was issued today to the Elks Home Company of High Point, the objects being to erect and own a suitable building to be occupied as a home for the Elks. The authorized capital is \$25,000, with \$3,000 paid in by Geo. A. Matton, Dallas Zollcoffer, P. E. Perkins and others. Three charters were granted by the secretary of state yesterday as follows:

The Highland Sewer and Water Company of Southern Pines, beginning with \$1,500 capital and authorized to \$10,000, the incorporators being Mrs. Helen Boyd Dull, Henry B. McCormick, Highland Park hotel and others.

The Fabrik Development Company, of Charlotte, chartered by W. S. Lee, Thomas Gusham and A. G. Springs, is authorized to capitalize at \$50,000, but begins at \$3,000 paid in.

The Freehold Realty Company of Charlotte, is incorporated with A. W. McDonald, John M. Scott and W. S. Alexander holding 110 shares of par value \$100 each. The authorized capital is \$125,000.
