Important to Farmers.
In order to have an accurate census taken next year it is necessary that full and correct answers should be given to the questions that will be asked. We call the attention of our readers to the following taken from the Observer:
"In order to facilitate taking the census and to insure necessity, we have been requested by Superintendent Francis A. Walker to direct attention to the provisions of the act relating to agricultural products. The census is to be taken in June. The crop reports must be for the preceding year.
A question will be asked a planter how many acres did you have for the year in cotton, and how much did you make per acre, &c.?
Such questions are relative to the year 1878. It will be necessary for the planter then to know how many acres he planted in the spring of 1878 and how much cotton he picked this fall.
To promote accuracy in the answer of those questions we are asked to direct attention to the subject. All of the crops raised in this State fall under the head of those for which a report is to be made for the year 1878.
Butter, cheese, milk sold; number and value of animals slaughtered; products of market garden, and forest products, and value of home manufactures are to be given in the twelve months between June 1, 1878, and June 1, 1880."
