Farm Notes.

A Little Land well tilled. Many farmers have learned that a little land well tilled, a little house well filled, and a little wife well willed, are among the greatest and most invaluable of earthly blessings.

Pickled Onions.—Select small silver-skinned onions, remove with a knife all the other skins, so that each onion will be perfectly white and clean.

March Pudding.—One cup of red apples, one cup molasses, one and one fourth cups flour, fourth cup butter, one egg, one teaspoon each of soda and cinnamon, half teaspoon cloves; wash and soak apples overnight, cut fine and mix with water in which they were soaked, add molasses and spice; mix egg, butter and flour together; stir soda with apples and molasses; add and bake immediately; serve hot with sauce made of half cup butter and one cup sugar beaten smooth and flavored with nutmeg, lemon or vanilla.

Rolls.—Two quarts of flour, one-half cup of sugar, a piece of butter or half dripping the size of an egg. Send one part of sweet milk and let it cool; then make a hole in the middle of the flour and pour in the milk and a half cup of yeast, and a teaspoon of salt.

To this bright agriculture is lending, and will attain at no very distant day. The time is coming when it will not be deemed necessary to employ a score of laborers to perform some petty and perhaps profitless job.

That these results are not only possible, but particularly attainable in a short series of years we positively assert. The whole secret of it lies in concentration—concentration of labor energy, manure, skill, thought and acres.

FOR HOUSEKEEPERS.

Chicken Broth.—Cut a chicken into small pieces; put in two quarts of water with a little salt, and boil it two hours; a tablespoon of rice and an onion may be added if you wish. This will make one quart. The chicken should be skinned, and the fat taken out.

Custard Pudding.—To a quart of milk add six eggs, a cup of sugar, a little salt and flavoring. Put the milk on in the milk boiler and scald it, then pour it into the eggs and sugar after they are well beaten; add a small piece of butter, put it into the pudding dish, and bake it fifteen or twenty minutes.

Apple Pancakes.—To an ordinary batter made with a quart of milk and four eggs, add six or eight apples peeled and chopped fine. The batter should be made thicker than usual, as the juice of the apples in cooking thins it. Make these cakes of large size and bake them on a gridle. Serve them hot, laying one on top of the other, with mixed powdered sugar and cinnamon spread between.

Potato Cakes.—Mix thoroughly with cold mashed potatoes left from dinner the well beaten yolk of an egg; make into cakes as you would sausage, place in skillet with a tablespoon hot lard or oil; dip in, cover tightly, and in five minutes, when lower side is browned, turn, remove cover, fry until the other side is a nice brown; serve hot. Make up after dinner ready for frying for breakfast.

Apple Snow.—Pare, core and bring to boil in as little water as possible six tart apples, cool and strain, beat well and add the well-whipped whites of three eggs, sweeten to taste and beat thoroughly until a dish of snow is the result, flavor with lemon or vanilla, or add the grated rind of a lemon; serve with sweetened cream. Or make custard of yolks, sugar, and a pint of milk, place in a dish, and drop the froth on it in large flakes.

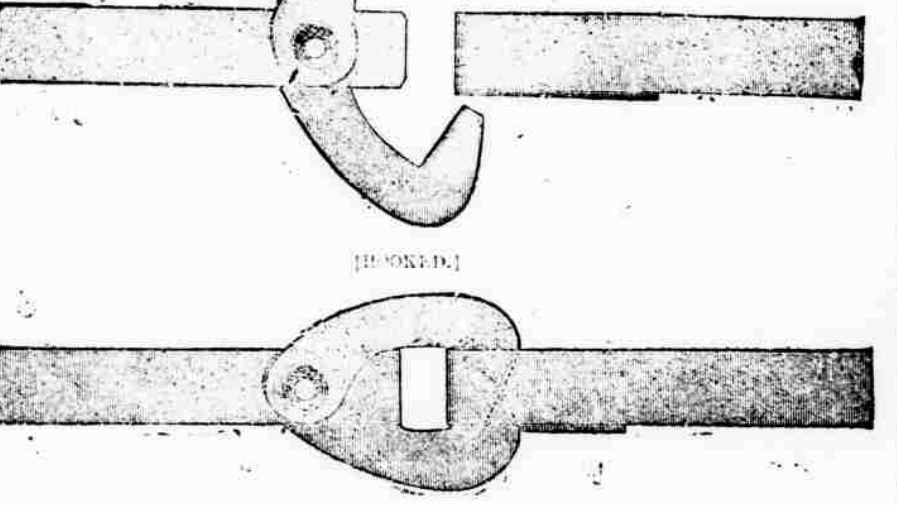
