AN EARTHQUAKE, on last Saturday night, almost entirely destroyed the town of Casamiccia, on the Island of Ischia, off the coast of Italy. It was one of the most appalling calamities of modern days; the number of persons killed and wounded being estimated at three thousand. Ocurring as it did, at night, the horrors of the catastrophe were rendered still more appalling, and the mind cannot conceive the awfulness of the terrible scene. It is horrible to think of so large a number of human beings meeting so sudden and terrible a death.

This Island of Ischia has felt the shocks of earthquakes several times before this, the last having occurred in March, 1881, when about three hundred persons were injured. We are glad that we do not live in such a country.

A Foolhardy Feat.

Capt. Matthew Webb the famous English swimmer was drowned last week in Niagara Falls while attempting a most foolhardy feat. A late despatch says:
