LOCAL RECORDS.

SCHEDULE PITTSBORO R. R.

The passenger train on the line of railroad leaves Pittsboro daily, except Sunday, at 10 a.m., and arrives at Pittsboro at 5:20 p.m., making close connection with the mail train on the S. & A. R. R., which arrives at Raleigh at 12:30 p.m., and leaves Durham at 3 p.m.

NOTE—Mr. Josiah T. Brooks, of Matthews township, was assaulted by a negro, named Green McLean, one day last week and badly cut with a knife. The negro then fled and has thus far evaded arrest.

NOTE—A black dog with yellow feet, half ear, and hind foot, was lost at the Soldier's Reunion last August. A dollar will be paid by its owner, J. W. Gold, a man of Rockville, for information as to whereabouts.

NOTE—There is some hope of establishing a small cotton factory at this place. Parties outside of the county have offered to subscribe forty per cent. of the necessary capital if our citizens will raise the remainder.

NOTE—It is hard for some of our townsmen to get accustomed to the new railroad schedule, by which our mail leaves in the morning and arrives late in the afternoon. A letter can now leave here for Raleigh after 10 o'clock and an answer be received the same day.
