An electric horse feeder, is a new invention brought out by Mr. Alderson, of Chesterfield, for securing the regular feeding of horses during the absence from any cause of the stableman or groom. The apparatus is described as being very simple, the law of gravitation being depended upon to accomplish most of the work. The first requisite is an alarm clock, which should be good enough not to stop casually, but need not be expen-The electric plant is that seed for an ordinary electric bell, four cells of the Leclanche type of battery being sufficient for any distance up to 200 yards. The third portion of the apparatus is the feeder—that is to say, the vessel he ding the corn and chaff, as the case may be. The clock, which is the prince mover of the whole concern, may be in the house, the harness room or anywhere, but if it be more than 200 fards away from the feeder a more powerful lattery will be required. To use the feeder, the first thing is to set the learn of the clock at the hour at which it is desired that the hourses should be fel. 




