OLD CITIZENS DEAD.—We much regret to hear of the death of Mr. William A. Marcus, which occurred at his residence in Williams Township, on last Friday. He was buried at Mt. Pisgah church with Masonic honors, and the large concourse of sorrowing neighbors who attended his funeral attested the high esteem in which they held him. He was about 70 years old, and was one of Chatham's best citizens, the war among the Ricard's oldest subscribers, having been a subscriber even since it was established, just seventeen years ago.
