Weekly Weather Crop Bulletin  
Central Office, Raleigh, N. C.

The reports of correspondents of the Weekly Weather Crop Bulletin, issued by the North Carolina State Weather Service for the week ending Saturday, September 29th, 1895, continue to be unfavorable. The extreme heat and dryness continued until early weather set in on Friday and Saturday. The mean temperature for the first five days averaged 83 degrees per day above the normal. Drought continues and crops are being damaged by all crops. Streams and wells are very low. Pests and blights are common, and are being gathered in. Very few and large crops of tobacco and hay have been saved. All planting still at a standstill for lack of rain.
