Immense Sums Invested in These Means of Urban Transportation. The great importance of the strent rallway interests of this country is

shown in a striking manner by some of

the statistics. While incomplete, the figures are believed to be accurate witha 5 per cent and are surprising in many respects. New York has the greatest then in all New England. Pennsylvania comes next, with 1.422 miles; then Ohio with 1,077 miles, Massachusetts with 069 miles and Illinois with 951 niles. The order of States arranged with regard to the number of cars is: New York, 9.115; Hilnois, 5.815; Pennsylvania, 4,021; Massachusetts, 3,896; and Ohio, 3,254. But this order is enirely changed when the number of care per nulle of track is taken into consider ation, for on this basis of arrangement the District of Columbia heads the list with 6.49, followed by Illinois with 6.12, New York with 5-76 Alissouri with 4-64 and Massachusetts with 4.02. The greatest capitalization per mile of track is \$111,290, in New York. It is \$81,700 in Pennsylvania, \$72,400 in Rhode Island, \$62,600 in Illino's and \$68,100 in Leuisana. The funded debt per mile of truck is largest in New York, where it is \$96, other high figures are \$72,400 in Rhode Island, \$01,800 in New Jersey, \$78,800 in Hilmois and \$51,000 in both Missouri and Maryland. The total cap-Ital Embilities per mile of track are \$207,100 in New York, \$146,800 in ode Island, \$120,400 in New Jersey, \$128,500 in Illinois, \$116,700 in Missouri and \$153,400 in Louisiana. The banner States in the matter of capitalization are Mississippi, Florida, South Dakota and New Hampshire, whose combined capital stock and funded debt amount to less than \$16,000 per mile of track, while enormously valuable metropoli-tan properties in New York naturally date its leading position,-


