

The Atlanta Exposition.

The most interesting and instructive exhibit at the Atlanta Exposition is that made by the United States government. This exhibit is contained in a building 250 feet long by 180 feet in width, to which there is an annex 140 feet long and 80 feet wide, making an area of 58,800 square feet. This building was erected entirely by the U. S. government and all the exhibits in it were furnished by the government. These exhibits are all arranged in a most systematic manner and so that they are to the advantage. For instance, in one part of the building are arranged exhibits from the Treasury Department, in another part are those from the Interior Department &c. A person would have to spend a whole day in each one of these departments before he could see and understand everything there in contained. For instance, in the exhibits of the Interior Department are many most interesting objects. In it are many models of patents granted to inventors of every description, which are very interesting and instructive. In this section may be seen specimens of the work of pupae in the fall, which show a skill and ingenuity of civilization that will surprise a visitor. In this department is the exhibit made by the Bureau of Education, which is well worth a close examination. We there saw a copy of a letter, which interesting statistics as to the progress of education in the United States in 1894. It shows that the number of teachers employed in the public schools of the United States were 213,333, or more than twice as many as there were in 1874, and the expenditures were \$1,000,000,000 as much. These statistics show the most gratifying progress and should be a source of pride to every citizen and friend of education.

Another interesting exhibit in the government building is that of the War Department. There can be seen all kinds and styles of warlike weapons, from the most improved musket to the most improved modern breech-loading rifle. Handguns are there exhibited, some of them twenty feet long and shooting immense projectiles. In this exhibit is an old four-horse wagon that was used by Sherman's army in its march through Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina. To the eyes of the southerner the sight of this relic did not arouse very pleasant feelings. There could also be seen many wax figures of soldiers, natural and life like in appearance, showing the different styles of uniforms worn by the Federal soldiers since the Revolutionary war. Some of the wax soldiers were mounted on wooden horses that looked exactly like real horses.

In the exhibit of the Post Office Department were representations of the different conveyances for carrying the U. S. mail. There was a sled driven by an Indian and pulled by dogs, that represented the mode of carrying the mail in the north west before the advent of railroads there. There was a life-like representation of the famous " Pony Express " that used to carry the news from San Francisco to California. And then, contrasted with these two exhibits, was a modern mail car, arranged with every convenience and comfort. There were also several framed collections of postage stamps of every kind and description that had ever been used. The "Dead Letter" exhibit contained numerous letters that had been sent in the past and received at the dead letter office in Washington. Some of these letters were very interesting, and it is strange that anyone should have attempted to send them to him. For instance, there was a small egg, a rattlesnake, an Indian scalp, a whiskey flask &c.

In the exhibit of the Department of State were arranged in a most interesting manner, the documents and valuable papers of our great men. There was a facsimile of the rough draft of the Declaration of Independence as first written by Jefferson and introduced by Adams and Franklin. There was the "staff of Franklin," and the sword of several of our great men, and also swords, medals and other gifts presented by foreign rulers. In the exhibit of the Treasury Department were specimens of our Federal money of every kind that had ever been used by the United States government.
