JONESBORO'S SURNISHER—SHERRMAN'S MARCHING—THE CLOSING SCENES &c.

When Gen. Johnston was informed that the gov. intended at Washington to break the "treaty of agreement", entered into by him and Gen. Sherman, he received negotiations with the latter, and they met on the 25th of April, at the B. and G. hotel in Pittsboro, and agreed to the following terms of surrender:

1. Adjutant general on the part of the troops under General Johnston's command to receive from the U. S. Army.

2. All arms and property, property being deposited at Greenesboro, to be delivered to our ordnance officer of the United States Army.

3. To receive the colors and issue to the colors duplicate, to copy to its present duty, and exchanged for those of our army.
