The President's long expected message was at last sent to both branches of Congress on last Monday, and seems to have been unfavorably received. It is a clear statement of the whole Cuban question, and concludes by saying that "the war in Cuba must stop." He asks Congress to authorize him to take measures to secure a full and final termination of hostilities and the establishment of a stable government in Cuba, and also to authorize him to use the army and navy as may be necessary for this purpose. He does not demand a recognition of Cuba's independence, and his failure to do this has given great dissatisfaction. He says the issue is now with Congress.

And what will Congress do?

No man can now tell, and it may be several days before Congress does anything definite. There is a very strong feeling in Congress to declare war, and end the conflict without regard to the independence of Cuba. The proposed armistice is variously viewed.
