ALTHOUGH the negroes compose only about one-third of the population of this State, yet in elections they hold the balance of power whenever there is any serious division among the white men.

And so it happens that, although there are twice as many white voters in North Carolina as there are negro voters, the latter have always been, ever since they were enfranchised, a disturbing and dangerous element in our State politics.

For instance, there are about 230,000 white voters in this State and 120,000 negro voters, and if one-fourth of the white men vote with the solid mass of negroes, it enables the latter to out-vote and defeat the other three-fourths of the whites.

Those who think it is not right will vote for the suffrage amendment and thereby eliminate the negro from politics, and so doing permit one-fourth of the whites, with the solid mass of negroes, to out-vote and rule over the other three-fourths of the free white people of our State.

The question to be decided by the voters of this State at the next election is simply this: Can the State of North Carolina be governed better with or without the votes of ignorant negroes?

This is about as simple and plain a statement of the great issue of the coming campaign as can be expressed. All those who believe and think that our good old State can be better governed with or without the votes of ignorant negroes will vote for the suffrage amendment. All those who think that North Carolina can be better governed with the votes of ignorant negroes will vote against the amendment.

We cannot understand how there can be any hesitation or doubt among intelligent and honest white men as to how this question should be answered. And yet this is the simple question to be answered at the next election: Can North Carolina be governed better with or without the votes of ignorant negroes?
