The Good Roads Convention held at Raleigh last week, was a notable event and we hope will be an inspiration and a stimulant for a deeper and more practical interest in the improvement of North Carolina's public roads.

Several able and practical addresses were delivered by men who fully understood what they were talking about, and a practical object lesson was taught in road building, which all could see and appreciate.

All the speakers declared that bad roads were more costly than good roads, and that the "land tax" was the heaviest tax that the farmers pay.

At the same time the Good Roads Convention was held at Raleigh there was also a meeting of a large number of the most prominent educators in the State.

It was very proper and timely that this educational conference and the good roads convention should be held in the same city and at the same time.

A feature of this bill will be of much importance to the South. It is that clause which requires the Director of the Census to issue monthly bulletins from the 1st of October each year until and including March 1st.
