NEW YORK city has been invaded by Dowie and his adherents, who are trying to proselytize its inhabitants to their strange faith, and it is probable that there will be many thousand converts. So marvellous has been the success of Dowie at Chicago it will not be surprising if he makes converts in New York.

The career and success of Dowie has been truly wonderful. It has been only a few years since he appeared in Chicago and founded his new sect. He pretended to be the reincarnation of the Prophet Elijah and has complete control of his deluded followers. He has built a large city near Chicago called Zion City, which is inhabited exclusively by his followers and where his word is supreme law. In some respects it is a model city and worthy the imitation of other cities.

Dowie and several thousand of his followers travelled from Chicago to New York on special trains. He has rented Madison Square Garden as headquarters for three weeks at a cost of \$1,000 a day. Every man is in uniform and carries a Bible in a belt. He will make a systematic house-to-house visit to every family in New York at least twice.

Brenken Father Murders His Children.

Spokane, October 15.

Asheville, Oct. 17.—Transformed into a monster after a week's debauch, the Rev. W. J. Jay, a physician of prominence in the north-east part of Buncombe's county, today despatched wife, Anna, brutally murdered his three children, and attempted to burn his house. The man became violent last night and after going home terribly abused his wife. Mrs. Jay had put the children to bed and was endeavoring to quiet her husband, when the man attacked her and drove her out of the house. She went to the home of Rhonda's Pillings home, mother from where she lived and there spent the night. Returning to her home this morning she found her husband in a stuporous condition. This man was a contractor who before day was continually looking for a house to buy, and, failing to find one, was evidently becoming impatient and the whole family. Mrs. Jay, however, had taken possession of the revolver and hidden it from her husband. Ten Men Hanged to Death.

Pittsburgh, Oct. 19.—By the breaking of the ropes carrying five beams to their position, letting the tons of iron fall upon the movable crane at the Pittsburgh end of the New Wabash Bridge, being built by the American Bridge Company over the Monongahela, almost a dozen workers were hauled to death by a fall of more than one hundred feet striking the water and two barges beneath. Ten of the dead have been recovered. Five are seriously injured. Several bodies are yet pinned under the wrecked bridge. The part of the bridge extending out from the Water street side is a total wreck.

Deputy coroner L. C. Hutchins, in charge of the investigation of the scene of the disaster. He believes the lumbermen who ever had charge of the scaffolding, holding fast at the fronting and fastening of the beams. He says that failure to properly secure one of the beams caused the breaking strain to fall on the crane.
