Utica Bares Head at Sherman's Bier. 25,000 Persons View the Vice-President's Body Lying in State. Private Services at House.

A detail of 30 members from each of the two National Guard companies in Utica preceded the funeral cortege. The private services in the house for the members of the family were conducted by Dr. Holden of the Dutch Reformed Church, of which Mr. Sherman was for many years the treas-

urer and active supporter. The services in the First Presbyterian Church began at 2 o'clock p. m., and were in charge of the Rev. M. W.
