ATTORNEY General James S. Manning has ruled that soldiers or sailors still in the service of their country until after the time of listing poll tax in 1919 are exempt from payment and may vote in the coming primary without payment of tax. This is a very wise and righteous ruling. The opinion reads in part as follows:

"These soldiers, either by their sense of obligation to their native country, or by the compulsion of the Federal Government, were, in their service to that country, placed in such a position that they could neither list nor pay these taxes. It would, it seems to us, be manifestly inequitable and unjust to deprive them of their right to vote under such circumstances, because they had not paid their poll tax.'


Made \$29,775 on One Hog


