

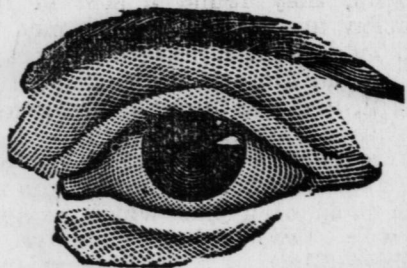
Oversubscribed.
