ANOTHER DANIEL COME TO JUDGMENT.

We take the following from the Democratic Press:

A GROSS BLUNDER!—AD VALOREM in Virginia!—According to the Register of Monday, Mr. Pool stated at Gatesville that "no southern State except North Carolina had any constitutional provision exempting slaves from taxation according to value and equal with other property."

It is this way Mr. Pool begins his address, we shall have hard work to keep him straight this summer!

The new constitution of Virginia, (of which it is likely Mr. Pool never heard) expressly provides that while taxation shall be based upon value, no slave shall be taxed as real estate, but per capita only!

And no slaves under 12 years of age shall be taxed at all! And it is further provided that in laying the per capita taxes on slaves, no higher tax shall be laid on a slave than is levied upon the value of three hundred dollars.

This sipient writer has made two gross blunders—one in supposing that Mr. Pool did not know the Constitution of Virginia on which he was commenting, and another that he, the writer, could understand it.

Virginia does tax slaves according to value, but "limits the value." All slaves in Virginia above 12 years of age, and up to any age to which they may attain, are taxed the same as three hundred dollars worth of land, the value of slaves in Virginia being thus limited by the Constitution of that State at \$300.

Now it will be seen that if the tax on land was raised to 60 cents on the \$100, the tax on slaves would be increased to \$1.80, and if the tax on land were to be raised to 80 cents, the tax on slaves would be increased to \$2.40, and so on in the same ratio.

Therefore there is no such capitation tax on slaves in Virginia as is limited by the present Constitution of North Carolina.

It is certainly firing a blunder-buss now which kicks harder behind than it shoots before.
