It is Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Alder-mu of the City of New-Berne, That from and a ter date all Barber Shops or aloons shall close at 10 o'clock, a. m., ou Sundays.

Be it further Ordained, That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

It is further Ordained, That from and after date, the sale of Bread on Sanday shall be confined to the regular places of business, and that said places shall close at 9 o'clock, a. in.

Be it further Ordained, That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

It is further Ordained, That from and after June 1st. 1868, all Vessels, Boats, and other crafts, bringing grain to this port, shall be allowed to retail the same for two days, and if desiring to retail for a longer period, the person or persons so desiring shall apply for and take out a retail licence.
