CITY ORDINANCES.

It is Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of New-Berne. That from and after date all Barber Shops or saloons shall close at 10 o'clock, a. m., on Sundays.
It is further Ordained. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

It is further Ordained. That from and after date, the sale of Bread on Sunday shall be confined to the regular places of business, and that said places shall close at 9 o'clock, a. m.
It is further Ordained. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

It is further Ordained. That from and after date, any and all persons (except Police) while in the discharge of their duty who shall discharge firearms within the city limits shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall pay a fine of Two dollars for each and every offence.

It is further Ordained. That section seventeen of the City License Tax Ordinance be, and the same is hereby repealed.
