Chinese Method of Preserving Grapes, Travelers inform us that the Chinese have a method of preserving grapes, so as to have them at their command during the entire season; and a recent author give us the folby visiting the vicinity of South Front and lowing account of the method adopted: It consists of cutting a circular piece out of a ripe pumpkin, or gourd, making an aperture large enough to admit the hand. The interior is then completely cleaned out, the ripe grapes are placed inside, and the cover replaced and pressed in firmly. The pumpkins are then kept in a cool place, and the grapes will be found to retain their freshness for a long time. We are told that a very careful selection must be made of the pumpkin, the common field pumpkins, however, being well adapted for the purpose in question.

The alleged cause of a failure to indict was owing to the absence of the only witnesses, the detertives. who made the arrest and upon whose statements, "that the colored men had confessed to them their guilt," the arrest and binding over to court was made. This absence of the only important witnesses appears to us significant, and we doubt much that if the conviction of the accused rests upon the testimony to be given by the detectives that it will ever take place. Arson and Robbery-The Perpetrators Brought to Justice. On Saturday night acting Constable Grover, of Township No. 5, arrived in this city, having in custody four colored men named Chancy Wise, Simon Williams, Henry Midget and Buren

These men are charged with arson and robbery, committed under the most aggravating circumstances. Mr. Grover informs us that on Joseph Mason and family, of Sand Hills, at the mouth of South River, were at church, and his residence entirely unoccupied-it was visited by some scoundrels, who, breaking it open, robbed it of everything portable, even and then setting fire to the building, they decamped. The building was entirely consumed; and when Mr. Mason returned he saw where his

house had stood, only a blackened ruin; All efforts to detect the authors of this outrage for a time proved unavailing, until a few days since, when some of the articles, stolen on the night of the fire, were discovered in the house earnest search resulted in finding other articles stolen on the same night, and finally led to the arrest of the men Wise, Williams, Midget and Jones, who were taken before Justice Grover of Township No. 5. when such evidence was adduced as to find Wise guilty of arson
