SAVED CASE OF DROWNING. We are informed by a gentleman conversant with the circumstances, that two brothers, named respectively Wince Nance and Everett Nance, both young married men, left home on the 30th ultimo, in a small boat, for the purpose, as they stated, previous to starting, of going to Capt. Willis' fishery, about 5 miles from Little River village, South Carolina.

We are informed that the Grand Jury of the Wayne county Superior Court, in session during the past two weeks, failed to indict the two colored men arrested in Wilmington sometime since on a charge of arson in setting fire to the Exchange Hotel at Goldsboro.

Arson and Robbery-The Perpetrators Brought to Justice. On Saturday night setting Constable Grover, of Township No. 5, arrived in this city, having in custody four colored men named Clancy Jones, Simon Williams, Henry Midget and Buren Jones—whom he lodged in jail.

These men are charged with arson and robbery, committed under the most aggravating circumstances. Mr. Grover informs us that on the night of the 8th of August last, while Mr. Joseph Mason and family, of Sand Hills at the mouth of South River, were at church, and his residence entirely unoccupied—it was visited by some scoundrels, who, breaking it open, robbed it of everything portable, even feather beds, and large articles of furniture, and then setting fire to the building, they departed. The building was entirely consumed; and when Mr. Mason returned he saw where his house had stood, only a blackened ruin.

All efforts to detect the authors of this outrage for a time proved unavailing, until a few days since, when some of the articles, stolen on the night of the fire, were discovered in the house of one of the men now under arrest. A more earnest search resulted in finding other articles stolen on the same night, and finally led to the arrest of the men Wise, Williams, Midget and Jones, who were taken before Justice Grover of Township No. 5, when such evidence was adduced as to find Wise guilty of arson and the others of being concerned in the robbery of the goods.

Among the goods stolen and recovered were two feather beds, guns, tables, &c. The evidence being conclusive, Justice Grover in default of bail, sentenced the accused to jail to await their trial at the next term of the Superior Court.

Chinese Method of Preserving Grapes. Travellers inform us that the Chinese have a method of preserving grapes, so as to have them at their command during the entire season, and a recent author gives us the following account of the method adopted: The process of cutting a circular piece out of a ripe pumpkin, or gourd, making an aperture large enough to admit the hand. The interior is then completely cleaned out, the ripe grapes are placed inside, and the cover replaced and pressed in firmly.
