It appears that a colored man in this city, a clerk for one of our merchants, did, for sometime, correspond with a friend of the same color in Raleigh. Unfortunately for the ties of friendship, there resided in Raleigh a white man bearing precisely the same name as the colored man, and who received, rend, and retained the letters written by the New Bernian, and answered them. In the course of time, the Mew Bern mon commonced sending various articles of property, crockery ware, dry goods, and general groceries, all of which, instead of reaching their proper destination, were received by the white man and anpropriated to his use.
