The following important decision was recently rendered by the Circuit Court of the United States for the Western District of Tennessee: CIRCUIT COURT OF THE UNITED STATES FOR THE WESTERN DISTRICT OF TENNESSEE.

A policy of insurance which indemnifies a public enemy against loss in time of war is unlawful, and where entered into before hostilities is, abrogated when they occur.

Where a life policy provides that it shall be void upon the non-payment of premiums within the time prescribed, such payment is a condition precedent; time is the essence of contract, and there can be no recovery if payment is omitted.

Where the performance of a condition precedent becomes unlawful, or by the act of God, impossible, this will not authorize a recovery upon the contract without performance.

A contract of insurance, the continuance of which depends upon the election and acts of the insured, is not like a debt, the obligation of which is absolute, and which is suspended only by war.

The relations between the members of a corporation for mutual insurance presents all the evils and are disturbed by war for the same reason as those between ordinary partners.

The reasons for the dissolution of executory contracts by war are not alone that such contracts involve inter-communication across the hostile lines, or that they relate to property liable to capture; but more especially because their execution increases the resources of the enemy.

A court of equity will not relieve a party from the effect of a contract if he has failed to perform a condition which is of the essence of the contract, although the performance is rendered impossible or impracticable by the act of God.
