Where deep breaking has been tion. done last fall, it is only necessary to make a fine seed bed by several harrowings and discings. A well pulverized seed bed is one 6 17 of the first essentials.

Where land has not been brokmore, I would suggest that it be rebroke with a long "bull tongue" drawn by two or three horses, making furrows not nals of distress. more than 12 inches apart, going as deep as you can. This method will crack the pan or su'-oili. without bringing it to the ur- painful. face. Be sure the subsoil is not too wet, then break deep as you night, can. Canserving of moisture to feed plants during a dry time are frequent, depends on the depth of soil.
