QUESTION AND ANSWER

Question: Can a young calf be cured of the scours?

Answer: The common scours, or indigestion, is one of the most frequent ailments of a young calf and can be cured by isolating the animal and reducing the milk ration at least onehalf. From one to three tablespoonfuls of castor oil mixed in a pint of fresh milk should then be given the animal. After the oil has acted, give a teaspoonful of a mixture composed of one part salol and two parts of subnitrate of bismuth or bicarbonate of soda. This can be repeated at six hour intervals until the diarrhea is stopped. This cure is for common scours. If the animal has white scours the animal should be isolated and a veteri-
