Raleigh, Dec. 10 .- The third State-wide meeting of the North Carolina Council on the Emergency in Education will be held at the Sir Walter Hotel in Raleigh Monday night. December 17. at 8 o'clock, B. C. Siske, Greensboro, State Chairman, announces. The two previous meetings were held in Greensboro, the first about a year ago and the second in October.

Immediate needs of the public schools, the teacher training schools and the institutions of higher learning will make up the program, which will be participated in by several State organizations. The object of the council, Mr. Siske explained, is to coordinate the efforts for education in this emergency by such groups as Parent-Teacher associations. Kiwanis, Lions, The State press, the State bar, the State Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs. the State Federation of Women's Clubs, the State Board of Charities and Public Welfare, the colleges and others.
