QUESTION AND ANSWER

Question: How can I cure colds in my poultry flocks?

Answer: The first thing to do is to isolate all birds showing symptoms of a cold. As this trouble is usually caused by poor ventilation, overcrowding, or poor feeding the cause should be found and corrected. Check carefully on the feeding program and give the flock Epsom salts at the rate of one-half pound to three gallons of water. The house should be thoroughly cleaned together with all drinking and feeding utensils. Slight cases may be treated by the use of a ten percent argyrol solution—a drop of this being placed in each eye, each nostril and in the slit in the throat. Where the disease is well established it is not economical to treat individuals and these should be destroyed.

MR. JEFFRESS TALKS ABOUT HIGHWAYS AS GOVERNOR VISITS HIM

Greensboro, Dec. 29.—Gov. J. C. B. Ehringhaus, paying his first visit yesterday morning to Edwin B. Jeffress, chairman of the state highway and public works commission, since the latter became seriously ill August 26, found him making what appears to the chief executive to be a miraculous recovery.

"It looks like a miracle, and maybe it is," asserted the governor after leaving the Jeffress home on Country Club place, Irving Park. "Jeff, exactly as I would have expected him, was concerned first for the highways. And he knew that the general assembly is about ready to convene in Raleigh. He knew exactly where the work was when he left it and picked up that work just at that point. He talked with perfect memory and with perfect connection."

The governor's visit to the sick chamber just before noon was brief but during the period he was there Chairman Jeffress discussed the highway program, referring to portions of it with the same exactitude that has

characterized his administration of the road system all along.
