his close friend and a leading investigator in the case.

To the left of the defendant, in a temporary seat facing him, sat Hauptmann's wife, Anna. The 10 selected today all are small-town or country people of moderate station. Three of the men are fathers of grown children; one of the women has a seven-year-old son.

Four were chosen at the morning session; the others during the afternoon sitting, which lasted less than three hours.

The speed with which they were selected astonished those who had believed the task would require at least a week.

Hauptmann, by court order, was not handcuffed at any time.

Deputy Sheriff Hovey Low, his chief guard on the walk from the county jail to the adjoining courthouse, carried handcuffs in his pocket, but did not use them.

Was A Sister of Mrs. E. Vyne, of This City; Funeral Held Tuesday. Mrs. L. F. Tillery, 70, who had been an invalid for the past three years, died in Rocky Mount December 31 of pneumonia following a brief period of serious illness.

Funeral service was held at 2 o'clock Tuesday at the First Presbyterian church in Shelby, of which Mrs. Tillery was an active member for many years, with Rev. Norman Johnson, pastor, in charge. Rev. C. E. Lynch, pastor of the First Presbyterian church in Wilson, assisted.

Her history of the First Presbyterian church attracted much attention. For more than a decade, she taught a class in the Sunday school and was an active participant in the Presbyterian program.
