

> **RABIES VACCINATION** MEASURE IS DEBATED Raleigh, March 13.-Dog leg-3-14-1t-pd. islation providing for the vaccination against rables of all dogs in the state once a year; the kind of lawmaking that Senator John Sprunt Hill prophesied if it did nothing else would ruin many a promising political career now budding in the legislature was left hanging in the air after an hour's argument in the senate today. Action was postponed by agreement of proponents and opponents when it appeared that amendments exempting nearly a score of counties were being offered and would destroy the effect intended in the bill. It was indicated by Senator Gravely, who sponsored this measure, introduced by Representatives Fenner and Abernethy in the house, that an effort will be made to revamp the measure to meet the objections of those who are trying to exempt their counties and that he will seriously contend for passage at a later date, probably this week. 


