Taken into consideration were initial cost, cost of operation, efficiency of refrigeration and ice freezing under extreme heat conditions, current consumption and cost of replacement parts.

Five porcelain finished Kelvinator models which were approved for marine use had to qualify under even stricter conditions, among which was the ability to operate during a rolling and pitching test during which time the refrigerator was standing at various angles as sharp as 40 degrees from the vertical.

The government's electric refrigerator requirements were much stricter this year and this tightening of federal requirements reflects, according to Kelvinator, a general insistence on the part of the public in general on higher quality and greater value in electric refrigeration

Dearborn, Mich., April 22 .-The 500,000th Ford V-8 manufactured since January 1 came was to make blanket awards for off the final assembly line at the Rouge Plant of the Ford Motor Company soon after the plant began work this morning, it was announced at the Ford office today. This does not include the 36,000-odd 1935 Ford units produced during November and December 1934.


