

Will Work Out Security Plan

Elliot to Try to Help State Benefit From Federal Unemployment Insurance

Washington, Dec. 17.—The office of Senator Robert H. Reynolds of North Carolina was advised today that Thomas H. Elliot, general counsel of the social security board, expects to go to Raleigh to work out a plan for the State to benefit from Federal unemployment insurance when it becomes effective Janu-

ary, it was said, probably will go to the North Carolina capital this Christmas to confer with Governor J. C. Brinkley and Attorney General A. A. F. Bennett, who are seeking to have an enabling act passed by the next State Legislature. The counsel expressed considerable doubt whether the board could sustain the act regardless of any rules and regulations that may be submitted by the State. Wesley E. McDonald, secretary to Senator Reynolds, told Elliot that the North Carolina statute made no provisions for payments or benefits, making a solution to the problem most difficult.

McDonald said the counsel stated emphatically the question did not have to be disposed of by the first of the year.

BUSINESS CENSUS WILL COMMENCE ON JANUARY 2ND

volume of annual business, and the total payrolls and employment. More than 100 representatives delegated by various business associations in each field to be covered, met with census officials and formulated the questions to be asked.

Retail trade will be divided into two size classifications: Stores with total sales of \$50,000 and over, and those with sales of less than \$50,000. Commodity data will be sought from the larger group and from all wholesale establishments including exporters, importers, and limited function wholesalers.

For the first time, Mr. Maddox announced, the census includes banking and finance for the entire range of commercial, agricultural and mortgage and personal credit finance as well as security brokers and dealers. Construction, including building, highway and heavy construction by contractors is included again, as in 1929. General contractors, operative builders and sub-contractors are to be covered.

Highway and street transportation, including trucking for hire and bus operations are included in the census for the first time. Commercial warehousing is included in the comprehensive plans announced today.

A census of the business of operating office, commercial and other non-residential buildings will be made in cities of more than 10,000. For the first time the operations of insurance companies, agents and brokers, real estate brokers and dealers, management and rental agents, as well as the business aspects of non-profit associations and organizations of every type, (exclusive of religious bodies) are included in the census.

The census of service establishments, which in 1933 included only personal, business and mechanical repair services, is extended in the plans to include certain classes of professionally trained persons. Mr. Maddox explained these include advertising counselors, architects, auditors, certified public accountants, engineering services, private detective agencies, market research services, map drawing and cartography services, and sales consultants. Theaters and hotels are to be covered as in 1929 and 1933, he said. Mr. Maddox declared the pres-

ent census is in answer to the request of business for dependable 1933 information for sounder planning of business programs, and is a continuation of the similar business censuses of 1929 and 1933.
