All single persons with an income of \$1,000 or more yearly and all married persons with an income of \$2,000 or more yearly must file returns regardless of exemptions, taxes or interest

All places of business doing a gross annual business of \$5,000 or more must file returns and returns must be filed by partnerships and corporations regardless of the amount of business done.
