EXPLAINS REASON FOR WORLD'S CONFUSION

Ridgecrest, Aug. 18. - Dr. James H. Franklin, of Chester, Pa., asserted tonight the world "today is in confusion because of the sins of racial hatred, economic greed and international hostil ity.

The speaker, president of Crozer Theological seminary at Chester. made the statement in an address to delegates to the southern Baptist Bible and Christian life conference here.

"We do well to ask what is required of us as ambassadors of Christ in dealing with such menacing form of unrighteousness," he said.
