Big Increase Shown In Federal Revenue

Total For First Third Of Fiscal Year \$9,816,366.08 Greater Than Last Year

Internal revenue collections in the district of North Carolina for the first third of the current fiscal year exceeded those in the corresponding period last year by \$9,816,366.08.

Announcement to this effect was made by Collector of Internal Revenue Charles H. Robert- son. His statement was based on the report compiled by I. T. New- ton, chief of the accounting di- vision in the office of Mr. Robert- son.

Collections for the first third of the current fiscal year aggre- gated \$107,719,754.40 by com- parison with collections of \$97,903,388.32 for the first third of the last fiscal year.

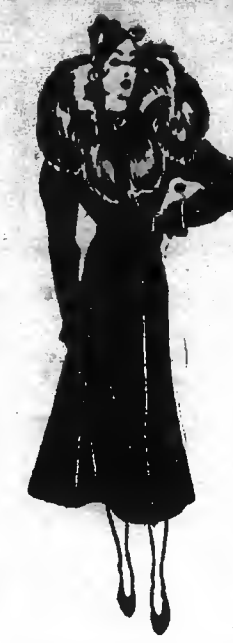
