TO LET CONTRACT FOR LAST LINK HIGHWAY 16

(Continued from page one) The highway 16 project, in both Ashe and Wilkes counties, is one of 18 included in the next letting, which will cost an estimated \$1,240,000.

Work is being pushed to completion on the second link of highway 16 between Millers Creek and Glendale Springs. The first link, extending from Mille's Creek to Wilbar, has been surfaced and is described as a most excellent link of highway.

The second link extends from Wilbar to the summit of the Blue Ridge through what is known as the "jumping off place" and near the Wilkes-Ashe line intersects with the Blue Ridge Parkway, where an underpass is planned.

The short link to be let will mean the completion of a hard-surfaced road between the Jeffersons and North Wilkesboro and will be the main thoroughfare connecting Ashe county with the greater part of the state. It will also be greatly beneficial to the many people residing in the communities along the route in both Wilkes and Ashe counties.
