Though the acre yield of peanuts in Martin County was lighter than usual this year, the quality was good and prices were fair.

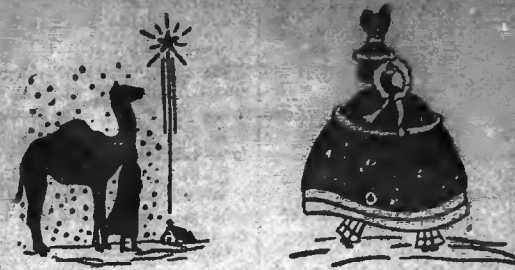
