Argument Against Spoed
Aside from being the major death cause on the highways, speed is excess--uely wasteful, according to scientific tests made of gasoline consumption. J. F. Winchester, author of "Mileage Hints" for Esso Marketeers, cites results of tests as follows:
"A recent study revealed that in miles per gallon when it was driven in first speed to 25 miles per hour, in second to 40 miles per hour and in high to 62 miles per hour. This same car, however, got 13 miles per gallon, or virtually double the mileage, when it was run in first speed to 15 miles per hour, in second to 27 miles per hour and in high to 43 miles per hour. The rapid acceleration cost additional gasoline consumption.
A similar test revealed how speed causes additional gasoline consumption. A car traveled 121 miles on 10 gallons 75 gasoline when driven at a speed of 75 miles per hour. When the speed was reduced to 50 miles per hour the distance traveled jumped to 176 miles and at 25 miles an hour the distance was further increased to 211 mile
