Clearness. Syrup or liquid clear, free from seeds, etc.

Texture. Tender, yet not overcooked. Only young and tender egetables should be canned.

Flavor. The natural flavor should be preserved as much as possible. In canning fruit too much sugar should not be used. Ripeness. Uniformly well ripened products; not defective or overripe fruits or vegetables.

Appropriate Size. Graded and sorted fruits and vegetables, uniformity of shape and size.

Pack. Arrangement with reference to symetry and best use of space within the jar. As large a proportion of solids to liquids as

Attractiveness of pack should be considered. Container. Containers should be uniform and of shape and size practicable to average home. Labels should be suitable, uniform

and neat, and should be placed under bottom of jar. Preference will be given to articles exhibited in clear glass containers. Unless article is of good quality, no premiums will be
