Washington.—The possibility that President Roosevelt might delay selection of a new Supreme Court justice until congress meets in January was considered today by capital politicians.

President May Wait Until Congress Is In Session To Name Man

Washington.—The possibility that President Roosevelt might delay selection of a new Supreme Court justice until congress meets in January was considered today by capital politicians.

Attorney General Cummings held last August that an appointment to the court could be made whether congress was in session or in recess. Hence the president, if he desires, could choose a successor to the late Justice Benjamin Cardozo in time for the beginning of court late in October. The senate, however, eventually must pass on all recess ap-

pointments. There were some who suggested Mr. Roosevelt might prefer to have the senate vote on the nominee before the latter convenes. But the president's decision on recess appointments is final.

There is a precedent for such a procedure. John Rutledge, of South Carolina, who had resigned as associate justice of the Supreme court to become chief justice of his state's highest court was appointed Chief Justice of the United States by President Washington in 1795. It was a recess appointment. As soon as the senate convened the appointment was rejected.

Farmers Oust Unionists


