**Wilkes Leads In Rye Production**

Raleigh. — North Carolina's three top-ranking counties in acreage devoted to corn, cotton, tobacco, wheat, oats, peanuts, rye, Irish potatoes and sweet potatoes, revealed in the 1938 State Department of Agriculture's Farm Census, were announced today by Census Supervisor S. M. Hines.

The three top-ranking counties, in order of their rank, are:

Corn—Robeson, 84,830; Johnston, 72,480 and Duplin, 70,170.

Rye—Wilkes, 4,700; Ashe, 3,550 and Cherokee, 3,200.

Cotton—Robeson, 46,170; Cleveland, 44,270 and Union, 41,060.

Tobacco—Pitt, 33,060; Johnston, 27,760 and Nash, 25,530.

Wheat—Stanly, 26,410; Iredell, 24,160 and Rowan, 22,790.

Oats—Union, 17,050; Anson, 16,660 and Rowan, 11,050.

Peanuts—Northampton, 34,670; Bertie, 32,920 and Halifax, 32,900.

Irish potatoes—Beaufort, 7,200; Pamlico, 5,910 and Wayne, 3,860.

Sweet potatoes—Columbus, 4,510; Davidson, 3,480, and Johnston, 3,460.

Nash county moved from fifth place in 1937 to third this year in tobacco acreage; Union moved from fourth to third in cotton; Stanly moved from fourth to first in wheat; Union moved from second to first in oats; Northampton moved from second to first in peanuts; Wilkes moved from second to first in rye; Davidson moved from seventh to second in sweet potatoes.
