Goldsboro, Jan. 29.-The old water tank on North John street has been decorated for nearly a week with icicles 40 feet long and many car loads of people have stopped to view the unusual and beautiful sight.

The sunshine glitters on the frozen tower and the frosted trees nearby. Water is blown in a mist from the tank and this freezes as it strikes the ground and as it falls on a little house nearby.
