#### State College Answers Timely Farm Question

Question: Is it necessary to apply any fertilizer to vegetable crops after planting?

Answer: The quality of succulent vegetables is dependent upon rapid growth and it is often necessary to make a side application of quickly available nitrogen n order to maintain vigorous growth. The time of applying the side dressing will depend upon the vigor and maturity of the crop and upon seasonal conditions. The grower must use his own judgment as to when to apply the side dressing.
