"Last year the Auxiliary extended help to 126,251 disabled veterans, expending \$986,387.71 in the work. A large part of this money came in the form of Poppy Day contributions, without which we would have been unable to give such extensive aid to these unfortunate men. Our volunteer workers made every penny count, their understanding and sympathetic service, in fact, expanding poppy pennies in dollars of benefit to the disabled.

"Most of the money contributed here on Poppy Day will remain right in Wilkes county for use in the work of our Unit 'among the disabled and dependent families here. We are at work constantly to make sure that men who served the country in its time of need are not without help in their time of need."


