He advocated and worked for the first County-wide Road Bond for improvement of Wilkes County Public Roads.
He sponsored and worked for the location of lot and building of North Wilkesboro's new Post Office.
He sponsored and worked with Hon. Pete Murphy and Hon. R. A. Doughton who were members of the Finance Committee in the House of Representatives in obtaining exemption of seven articles of food from the Sales Tax.
He has originated numerous State-wide measures which have been enacted into law in behalf of the taxpayers.
He has built and paid for more concrete streets, sidewalks and buildings than any other individual in North Wilkesboro.
