

\$2,000 in Cash Premiums Offered For Exhibits At Fair Sept. 10-14th

The Great Northwestern Fair, which will open a five-day exposition at the fairgrounds in this city on September 10, will give away \$2,000 in premiums on exhibits of farms, homes and orchards.

The liberal cash premiums are expected to attract a large number of excellent exhibits and arrangements are being made to have plenty of space in tents to house the exhibits.

Individual cash premiums range from a small amount all the way upward to \$100 and are well worth trying for.
