ing cars, and that he was driving about 35, not over 40, miles per hour. He said he went on a short distance, turned around and went back to the scene of the accident within five or ten minutes to render whatever aid he could. Bumgarner had died on the way to the hospital here after he was picked up a distance of what witnesses said was several feet from where he was hit.

Bumgarner, who was 48 years of age, was well known in Wilkes, having for several years operated mercantile establishments at a number of points and more recently operated a long distance trucking business.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Ida Bumgarner, and three children, Claude and Paul Bumgarner and Mrs. Carl Church.

Funeral service was held Wednesday, two o'clock, at Pleasant Grove Baptist church with Rev. L. B. Murray conducting the last rites.
